What is the IBCP Core?

The IBCP options incorporates the educational principles, vision, and learner profile of the IB into a unique offering that specifically addresses the needs of students who wish to engage in career-related education.

Personal and Professional Skills

The IBCP approaches to learning course introduces students to transferable life skills to help students make sense of the work around them. The course emphasis critical and ethical thinking, intercultural understanding and the ability to communicate effectively.

Community and Service

The IBCP core is based on the principle of service learning, using community service as a vehicle for new learning with academic value. The service learning model in the IBCC. Emphasizes knowledge, civic social and personal development.

Language Development

In the IBCP all students will have access and are exposed to, a second language that will increase their understanding of the wider world. Students are encouraged to begin or extend the study of an additional language that suits their needs, background and context.

Reflective Project

Through a reflective project students identify, analyze, critically discuss and evaluate an ethical issue arising from their career-related study. The work encourages the student to engage in personal inquiry, action and reflection and to develop strong research and communication skills.

What are the IBCP Requirements?

International Baccalaureate Career-Related Program Requirements:

- A minimum of two and a maximum of four Diploma Program courses—Min one HL, one SL
- An IBCP core consisting of:
 - A language development extension that suits their needs, backgrounds, and context
 - A 50 hour community and service component completed and documented over 2 years beginning September of 11th grade and not before
 - A reflective project which will analyze, critically discuss and evaluate an ethical dilemma associated with a particular career path
 - A Personal and Professional Skills course second semester of junior year 7th period and first semester of senior year during the A two year career related study in one of the following areas:
